Established on 16 June 1980 through Batas Pambansa 79, the Commission on Filipinos Overseas (CFO) is an agency of the Philippine Government under the Office of the President tasked to promote and uphold the interests, rights and welfare of overseas Filipinos and strengthen their ties with the Motherland.

The evolution of the Commission on Filipinos Overseas can be traced over a series of policy pronouncements. Presidential Decree No. 442 (Labor Code of the Philippines), which was passed in 1974, created the Overseas Employment Development Board in order to set up a systematic program for the overseas employment of Filipino workers, as well as to register and monitor emigrants leaving for various countries. The following years were characterized by a steady increase in migration, thus making it necessary to establish an independent unit which would constitute a local support network solely for Filipino emigrants. In June 1978, Presidential Decree No. 1412 was passed the Office of Emigrant Affairs (OEA). The decree specifically identified Filipino emigrants as the recipients of its services.

In June 1980, Batas Pambansa Blg. 79 was enacted to strengthen the government's policy on the promotion of migrant welfare and interest. It created the Commission on Filipinos Overseas which replaced OEA but retained and further expanded its mandate.

The CFO registers and provides pre-departure orientation seminars to emigrants. It also promotes the transfer of technology as well as material and financial contributions from overseas for development projects in underserved communities all over the Philippines. It also provides younger generations of Filipinos overseas with opportunities to learn Philippine history and culture.

To be the Philippines' premier institution in promoting policies, programs, and projects with Migration and Development as a framework for the strengthening of and empowering the community of Filipinos overseas.

Vision

The Commission on Filipinos Overseas envisions a community of well-respected and proudly competitive Filipinos overseas who contribute significantly to the productivity and well-being of the countries where they reside or work while maintaining strong political, economic and cultural ties with the Philippines.

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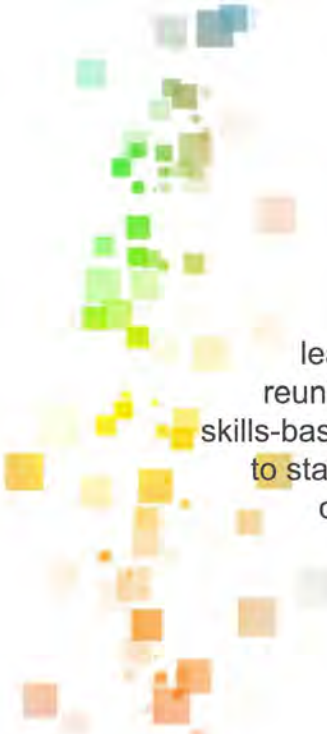
Introduction

The 2017 CFO Statistics on Philippine International Migration contains data on international migration collected and processed by the Commission on Filipinos Overseas. The CFO, which is the co-chair of the Inter-Agency Committee on Migration Statistics (IACMS) under the Philippine Statistics Authority, has been identified as one of the primary sources of data on international migration. The IACMS developed the Amended Operational Framework for Counting Overseas Filipinos and International Migrants (PSA Board Resolution No. 07, Series of 2017).

The CFO data is classified into migration flow, migration and development, and assistance to nationals statistics. Specifically, the data featured in this compendium include statistical profile of registered Filipino emigrants, spouses and partners of foreign nationals, Exchange Visitor Program participants, au pairs, diaspora philanthropy thru the CFO's Linkapil Program, Philippine Schools Overseas, and Anti-Human Trafficking initiatives of the CFO.

The data covers a ten-year period to provide the public with information on Philippine migration trends.

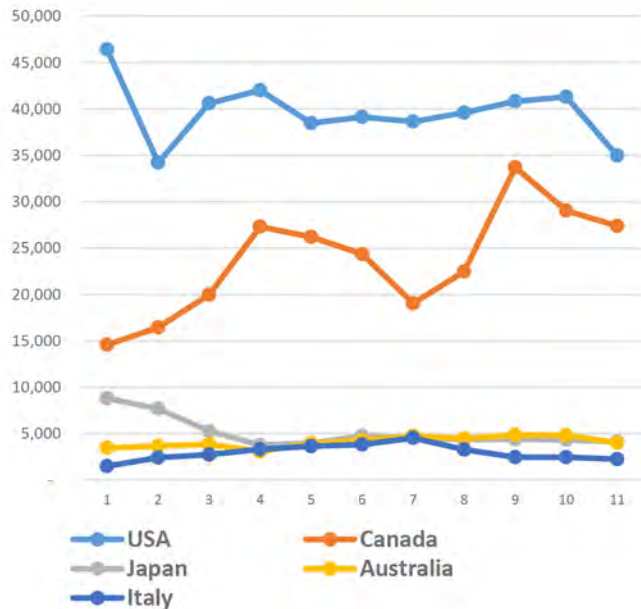

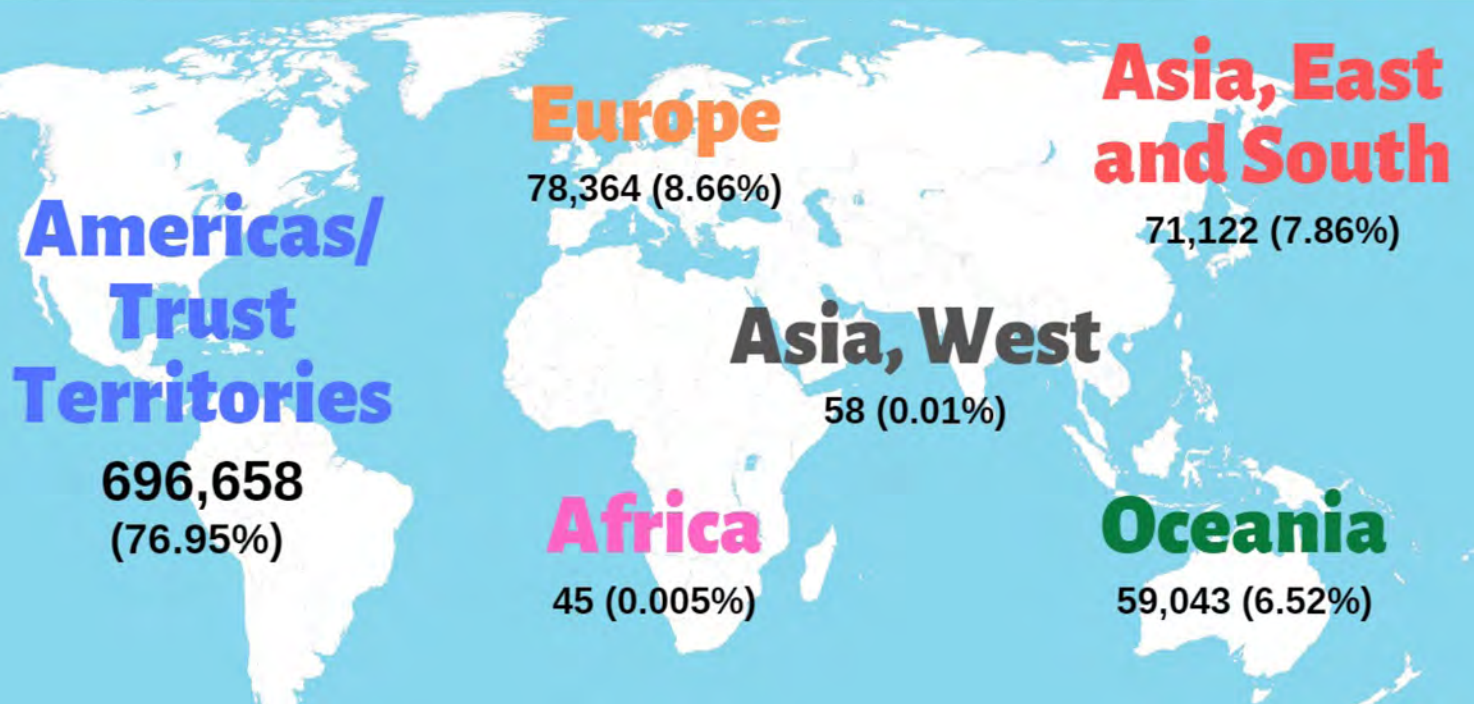


Migration Trend

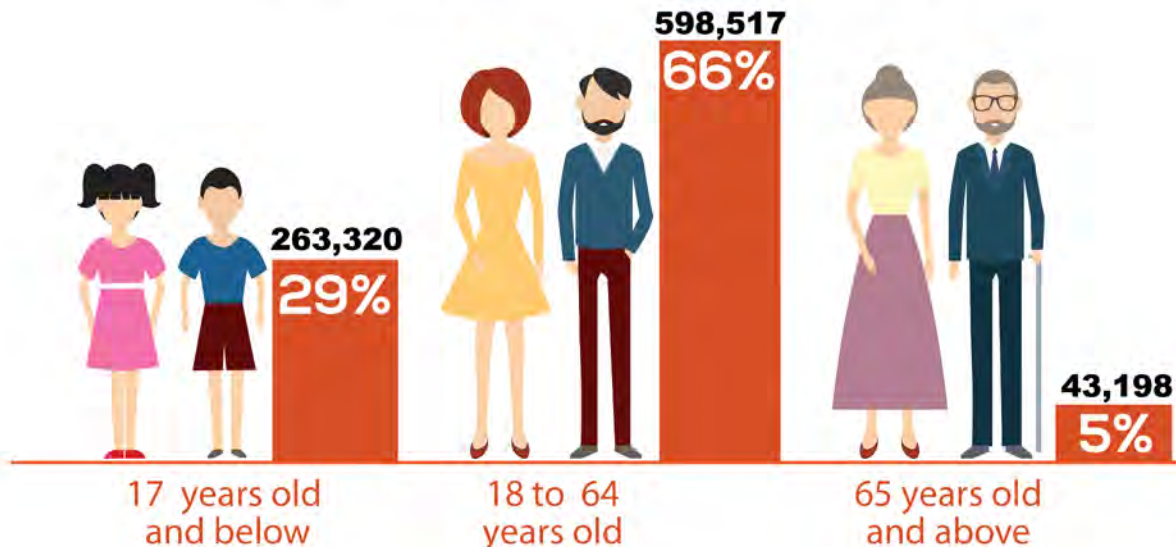

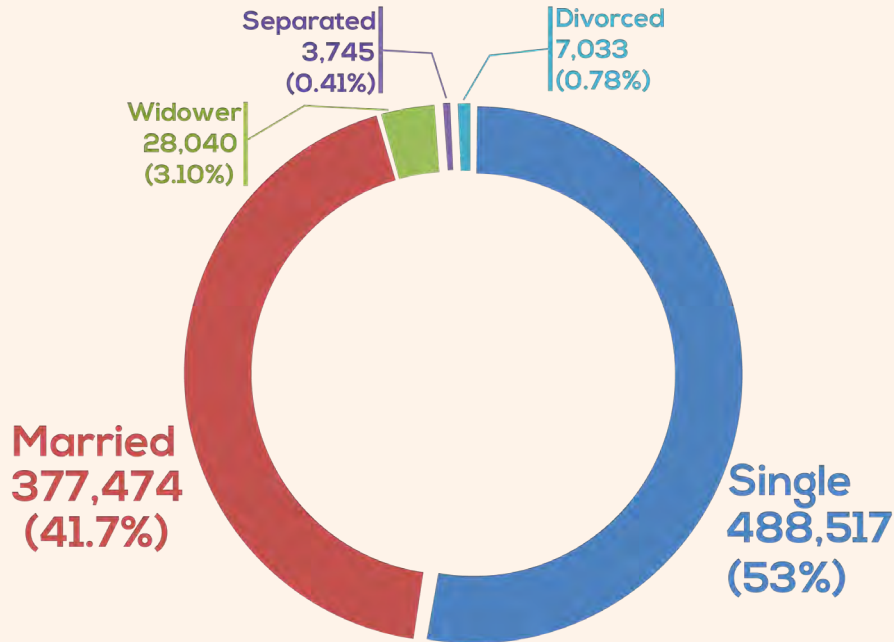

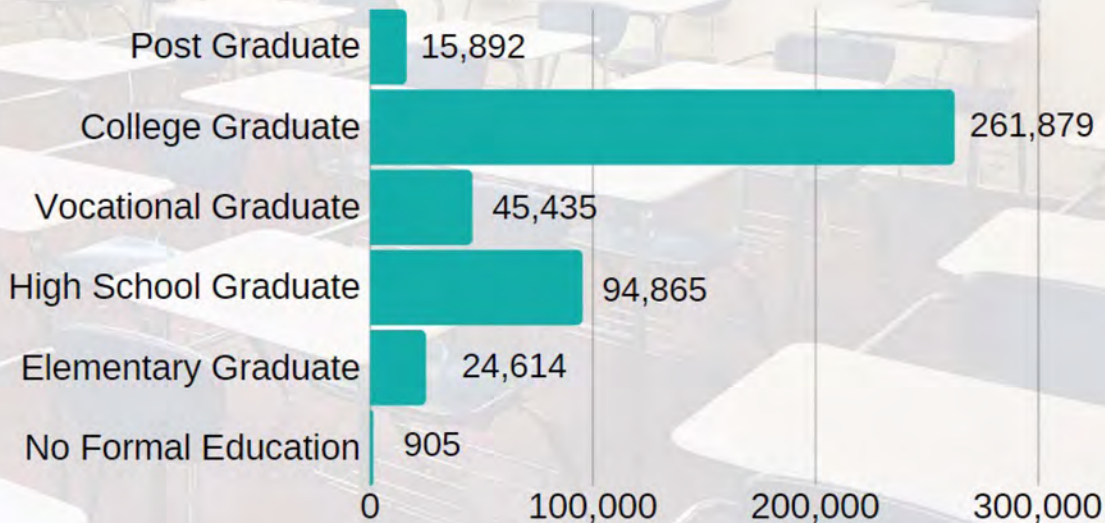
NUMBER OF REGISTERED FILIPINO EMIGRANTS

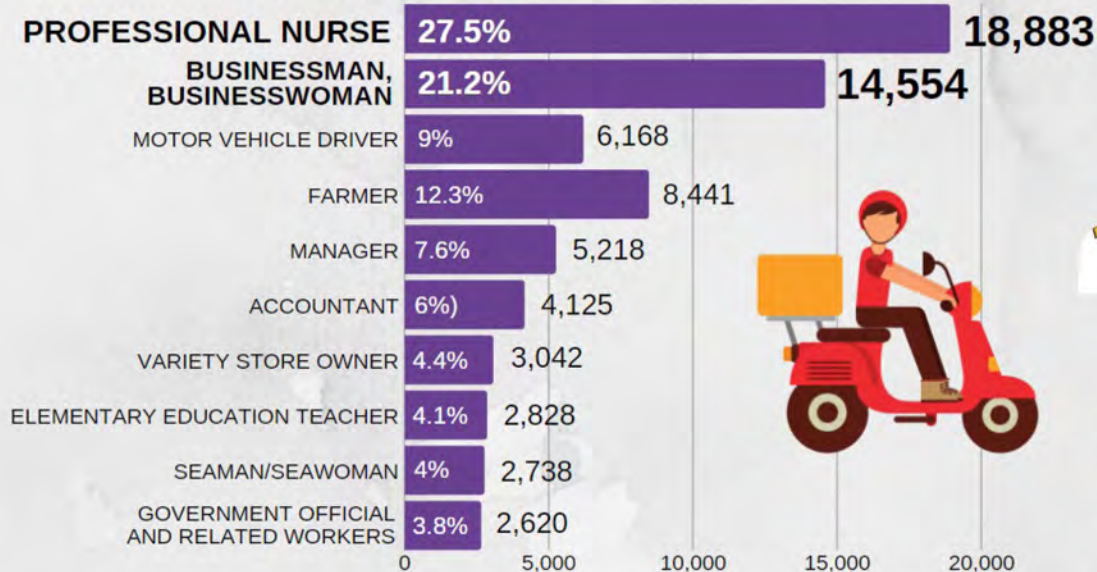

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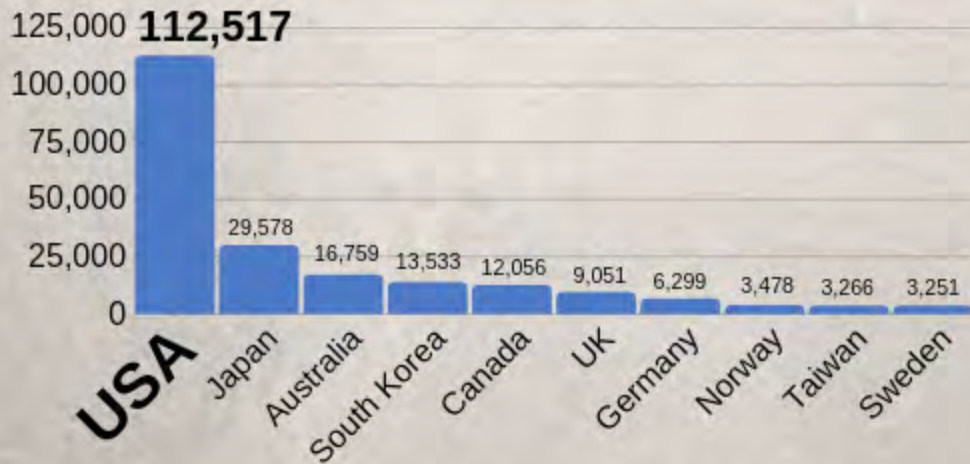

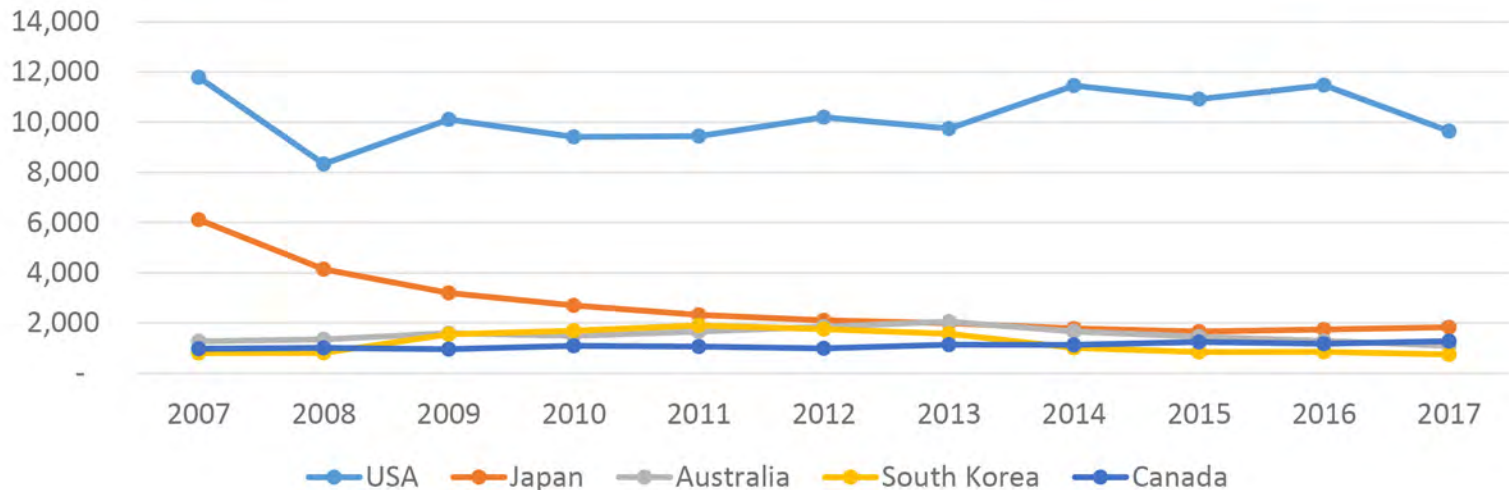

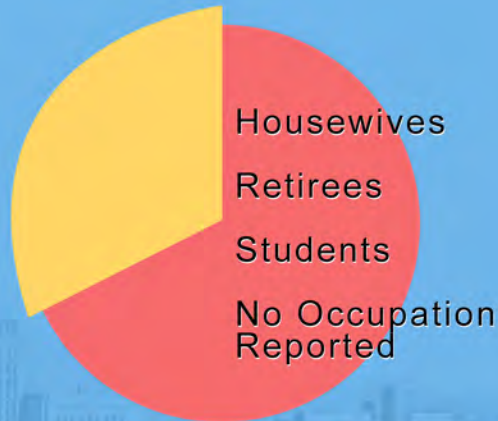
Ratio of Working to Non-working Filipino Marriage Migrants

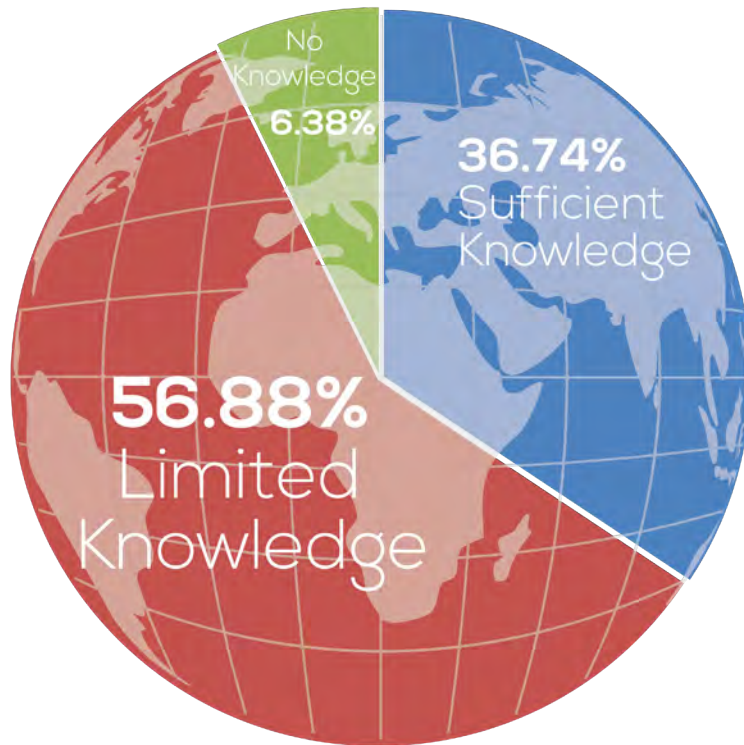

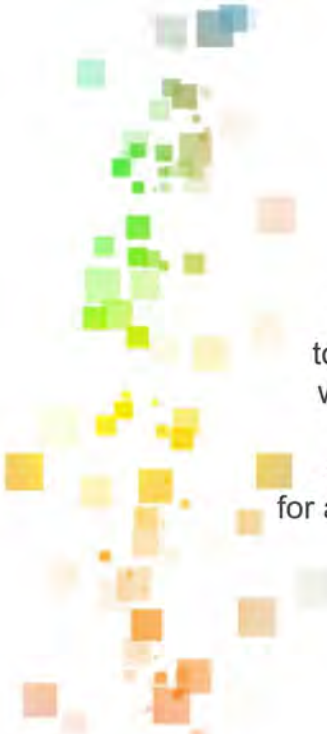

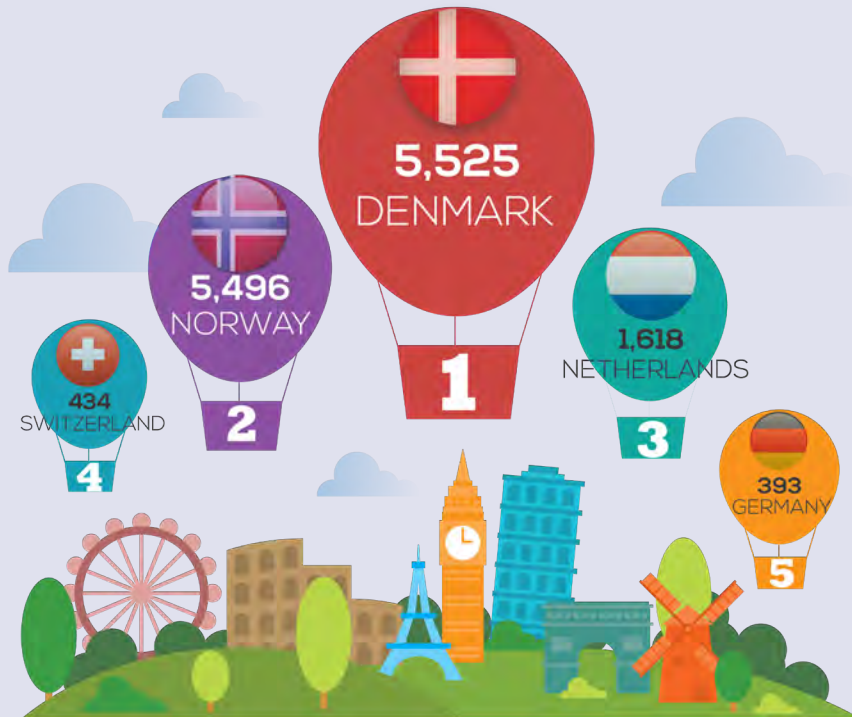

OF REGISTERED AU PAIR PARTICIPANT (2012-2017)



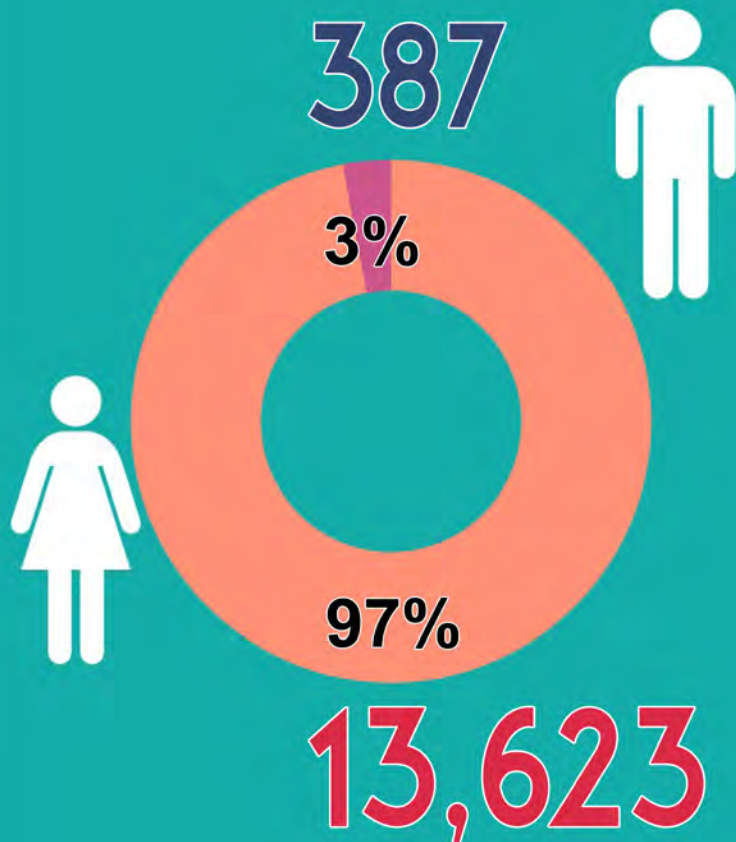

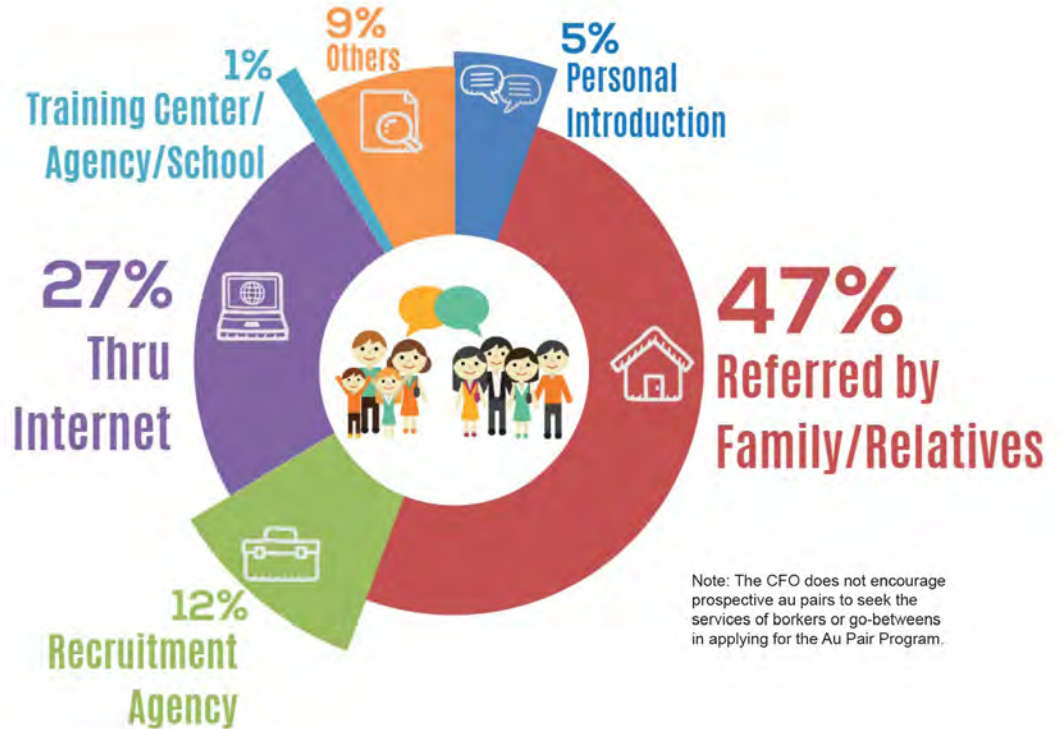

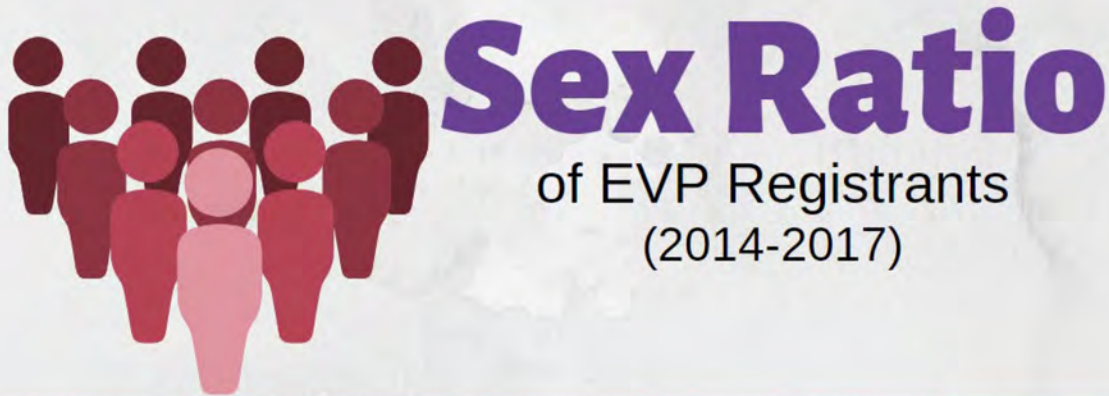

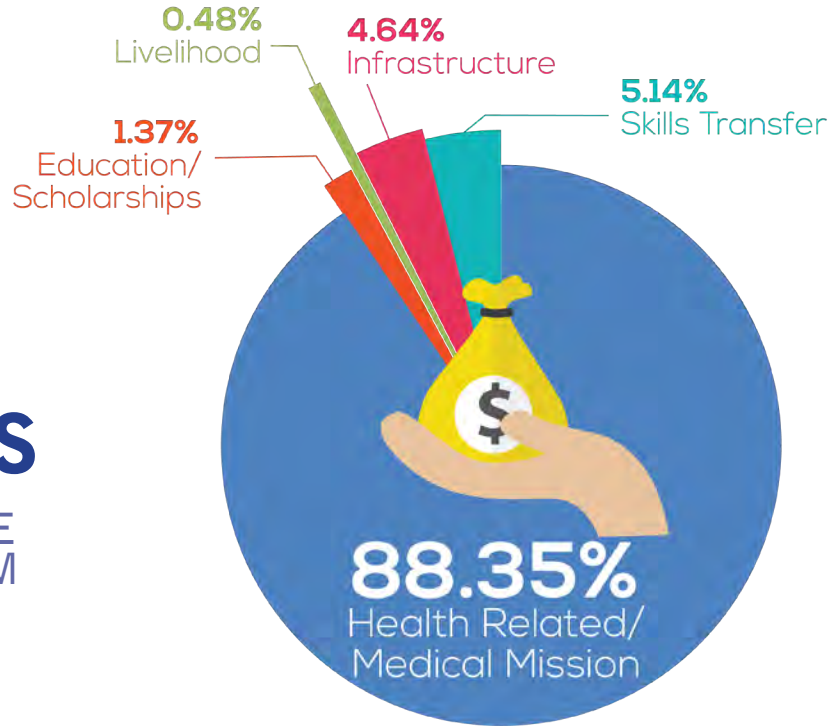
